"DO US JUSTICE"

1. The reporter says that she "has been in the secret service of the government." In other words, she was a spy.
2. Richards said that the Southerners "took pains"—or made a great effort—to bring the Confederate

wounded to Richmond as quickly as possible. On the other hand, the wounded Union prisoners were brought in a week later and were treated roughly, seemingly just thrown to the ground from wagons. In addition, people who tried to care for the Unionists were threatened with prison themselves.

3. Van Lew "disguised herself as a beggar" and pretended to know some of the prisoners. She criticized others for being Unionists so that the guards wouldn't think she was a Union sympathizer.
4. The writer describes a crowd so excited about the lecture that there was not enough room in the church for them all. When telling about how Richards spoke of the mistreatment of wounded Unionists, the writer includes groans from audience members, who may have been imagining how the wounded felt. The reporter also quotes some of her words directly.
5. She was referring to formerly enslaved black people. Richards was worried that Northern abolitionists would only say they were sorry but do nothing specific to help those who were now free. And she worried that if formally enslaved people didn't receive justice, they might feel so angry that they would raise an "insurrection."
